## REGULATIONS LAID DOWN BY THE ANIMAL & PLANT HEALTH AGENCY (APHA)

1. Any farmland used for a show or exhibition must be empty of susceptible livestock for 24 days prior to the event.
2. The names and addresses of all exhibitors and other persons handling stock at shows should be recorded by the person responsible for the stock and retained by the organisers for three months beyond the date of the show. This information should be provided on request of APHA or local authority animal health inspector.
3. All livestock moving to a show should be identified in accordance with the current legislation – SAGRIMO, CIR(S) and PRIMO.
4. Livestock movements on/off the show should be notified/reported as set out in the above legislation. Movement documents should be issued for each move. Please note that whilst Agricultural Shows may facilitate movement reporting on behalf of keepers, it is ultimately the responsibility of the keeper to satisfy themselves that records pertaining to their animals are up-to-date and accurate.
5. Appropriate standstill periods should be observed prior/following the movement:  
Animals moving to shows for exhibition for the first time will not have to be kept separate prior to moving to the show irrespective of whether any other livestock have been moved onto those premises in the 13 day period immediately before moving. If attending only one show within any one 13 day period the animal will not require to be held separate on return from the show nor will the return home trigger a 13 day standstill for any other animal on the home farm. Also animals may move from show to show or may return to their usual premise of residence without triggering a 13 day standstill provided they are kept in separate facilities under an authorised separation agreement with SGRPID.
6. All animals taking part in the show must return to their premises of origin.
7. The Transport of Animals (Cleansing and Disinfection) (Scotland) Regulations 2005 applies to vehicles taking animals to and from the show.
8. Show organiser is obliged to notify APHA ASAP in the event of suspicion of notifiable disease at the show.
9. Stock may be inspected at shows in order to satisfy disease control measures.
10. Sterilised milking units must be provided at the Show and must be suitably disinfected between each cow. If hand milking is practised, the milker must disinfect his hands between each cow.
11. Dams may suckle their calves, but otherwise calves may be fed on reconstituted milk only.
12. Water, milking and grooming points should be clearly marked and used by no other stock.
13. If an animal is showing evidence of calving or aborting, it must be isolated and local APHA office should be contacted ASAP for further instructions. A licence for the affected animal will be required to allow for movement off the event.
14. Farmers should ensure that they are aware of any relevant pre/post movement TB testing requirements. For more information see the Scottish Government website: [www.gov.scot/publications/bovine-tb/](http://www.gov.scot/publications/bovine-tb/)
15. No person other than show officials, judges, marshals and the owner or his representatives shall be permitted to enter the Showring.
16. There should be suitable hand-washing facilities for judges required to mouth animals or preferably the stock handler should be asked to open the mouth for inspection. Disposable gloves, changed between animals should be used. In terms of cleansing and disinfecting footwear from pen to pen it is best practice to use footbaths as often as it is possible.
17. Exhibitors must comply with instructions notified by SAMU, BCMS and DVM.

### **BOVINE VIRAL DIARRHOEA (BVD)**

- Any animal coming from a 'negative' Scottish breeding herd can move to a show.
- Any animal from a 'not negative' herd cannot move to a show unless it has an individual BVD negative status.
- No animal from a 'positive' herd can move to a show, regardless of individual BVD status, as it will not be able to return home. (A 'positive' herd is one with known BVD positive animals)
- No animal from a Compulsory BVD Investigation non-compliant holding can move to a show, regardless of individual BVD status, as it will not be able to return home. (A Compulsory BVD Investigation non-compliant holding is one that has failed to meet the legal BVD testing requirements and is under movement restriction on all ON movements).
- It is advisable that any animal coming from outside Scotland should either be from a BVD CHeCS accredited herd or be individually tested negative for the BVD virus.
- It is advisable that any animal from a Scottish non-breeding herd should have an individual BVD negative status.

### **SHEEP / GOAT HEALTH STATUS**

Stranraer Show has approval from SRUC to run certain sheep & goat sections as MV/CAE accredited.

Health Status Reports will be verified **prior to** unloading. **The MV / CAE Health Report must be:**

- Fully completed and valid
- **The Expiry date must be later than date of the movement and within date of the show**
- All sections must be completed in full for the Health Status to be valid including:
- Signature and date
- Ear Tag numbers of all sheep
- Up to 20 animals can be listed on on Health Status Report, however, a supplementary written/printed sheet with Ear Tag numbers of any additional sheep is acceptable, and may be **attached to the original** completed Health Status report with **Member's name and holding number** included.

### **SCRAPIE**

All females of all breeds of sheep to be exhibited must (i) be non-pregnant (empty), (ii) not have lambed within 30 days prior to entry to the Show, (iii) not be or have been subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern.

Stranraer Show is an SMS UNSEGREGATED Show – flocks who are part of the SMS scheme, are SMS negative or have Scrapie Qualifying status should be aware of the rules they must comply with and attendance at the show is at your own risk. You should contact SRUC or APHA for more information.

### **BLUETONGUE (BTV)**

Bluetongue is a serious disease threat to livestock, and the situation changes quickly and seasonally.

- Controls for bluetongue susceptible animals are expected to be in place from approximately mid-May until early September.
- Animals moving from a bluetongue Restricted Zone or other bluetongue control zone into Scotland, while Scotland remains free from this disease will be subject to movement controls.

The Committee reserve the right to make changes to entries and classes as the need arises.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS for ALL Exhibitors

1. The stock in all Classes must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor for at least Thirty Days before the date of the Show, except where stated otherwise.
2. A competitor may show more than one lot in any Class, but cannot enter a lot in one Class and afterwards withdraw it for competition in another, except as stipulated. Classes will be judged in numerical order.
3. Entries must be made online or in writing, by completing the Membership & Entry Form and lodging this Form, along with the entry money, by 10th July, 2026, with the Secretary. **Should the Secretary be able to take an Entry after that date, Entry Fee will be at DOUBLE NORMAL RATE.**
4. A list of Stock to be exhibited will then be compiled. **No Stock will be allowed to compete which is not included in that list.**
5. The organisers reserve the right to cancel, amalgamate and divide classes where necessary to facilitate the running of the show.
6. Stock attendants must bring same into judging ring when requested to do so by the Stewards. All Stock not in the judging ring when the judging starts will be disqualified and not allowed to compete in the Class being judged. All cattle and horses must be led. All bovine male animals over ten months to be secured by the nose.
7. All Stock Attendants are prohibited from speaking to the Judges, except in answer to questions put. Stewards appointed by the Committee will attend the Judges of the respective Classes of Stock, who will communicate with the Secretary; and all other persons are prohibited from entering the ring on pain of disqualification of their stock.
8. The Stock exhibited will not be distinguished in the Judging Enclosure by the Name of the Breeder, Feeder or Owner until after the Premiums are awarded, but only by Tickets or Numbers to be affixed to each lot, corresponding to the list made up by the Secretary. Catalogue number must be displayed on animal when in judging ring; otherwise it may be disqualified.

**9. Horses and Cattle must be paraded when required by the Stewards, and under their direction. Attendants must be beside their animals fifteen minutes before the hour of parade, and be ready to proceed to the ring immediately on receiving the orders from the Stewards. Infringements of this Rule, or failure of any attendant to obey the orders of the Stewards or Society officials, may incur forfeiture of all or portion of Prize Money. Animals must not leave the Showground until after the Parade except under Vet's instructions.**

10. The Gates of the Showyard will be open at 7 o'clock on the morning of the Show and the different lots must be brought to the ground between that hour and 9 o'clock, except by special permission of the Committee, who will have the entire management of everything connected with the Show.
11. The Judges will begin to view the exhibits at 9 o'clock.
12. Where the Special Rules of any Section are at variance with these General Regulations, the Special Rules will apply.
13. Protests against the awards of the Judges (which on the merits of each exhibit shall be final), or in regard to any matter connected with the Show, must be lodged in writing, with the Secretary, not later than 12 noon on the day following the Show; and the same shall thereafter be disposed of by the committee appointed for that purpose by the Society. All questions as to the validity of the protests lodged shall be determined by the Committee. Each protest must be accompanied by a deposit of £20; and if not sustained the sum deposited may, at the discretion of the Committee, be forfeited to the Society. All decisions of the Committee shall be final, and it shall not be competent for any exhibitor to appeal against such decisions nor to seek redress in respect of them from any other tribunal.
14. The Prizes awarded will be paid in 2026.
15. The Society shall not be liable for any loss, injury or damage which Stock, Implements, or other Exhibits or Individuals may sustain at the Show, or while in the Showfield.

16. The Society would draw the attention of exhibitors to the following: “Any exhibitor winning a trophy must accept full responsibility for any damage occurring to that trophy whilst in their care and possession. Exhibitors should make suitable arrangements through their household insurers, to ensure their interests are protected”. All trophies remain the property of Stranraer & Rhins of Galloway Agricultural Society and should be returned by exhibitors when requested by the Show Secretary. Failure to return trophies may result in a financial penalty.
17. In all Sections only First Prize-winners in Single Classes will be eligible to compete in the Championship, but in determining the Reserve Champion the Second Prize-winner of the class from which the Champion has been selected will be allowed to compete.
18. Livestock handlers should be of a suitable age to lead and control exhibits.
19. The Association’s Veterinary Surgeon or Surgeons will examine and report on any Animals which have been altered in appearance in order to mislead the Judges by a procedure / practice which causes pain. They may inspect and examine any Animal as soon as it enters the Showground and as long as it may remain there. On their representation that improper practices on any animal have been resorted to, the animal shall be disqualified from competing for prizes and the offending exhibitor may be otherwise dealt with as the Committee may consider appropriate.

**Correctly secured Skull Caps / Riding Hats to the current safety standards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green.**

**If you enter the same horse/pony in different sections there is a possibility classes will clash and you may not be able to reach the other ring in time.**

**As an exhibitor it is your responsibility to be present in good time for your respective classes. NO refunds will be issued for missed classes.**

All ponies shown in the Mountain and Moorland section must be shown un-plaited.

2<sup>nd</sup> and every alternate row purl

3<sup>rd</sup> row (k5 k2tog) 9 times k1

5<sup>th</sup> row (k4 k2tog) 9 times k1

7<sup>th</sup> row (k3 k2tog) 9 times k1

9<sup>th</sup> row (k2 k2tog) 9 times k1

11<sup>th</sup> row (k1 k2tog) 9 times k1

13<sup>th</sup> row (k2 tog) 9 times k1 (10 stitches)

Break yarn off and run through the remaining stitches draw up and join the seam.
